

In the immediate aftermath of the Libyan revolution, we were able to provide communications solutions for several embassies seeking to reopen their offices in the country. Within 30 days, Orange restored its communications and set up full connectivity for these customers.

Orange has strong expertise in supporting VSAT license acquisitions, which can otherwise be difficult to get. We installed VSATs based on 2.4m dish direct platforms at the embassies but can install larger dishes as needed. You can use simple any-to-any connections with fully-managed and enhanced customer care or multiple satellite technologies with any Orange teleports around the world and still get the service quality you need to run enterprise applications, such as video or resource planning.
